# 1975 Bicentennial Commemorative Stamp

Stamp issued from the 200th anniversary of the Battle of Bunker Hill. On June 17, 1775, the Continental Congress convened in Lancaster, Massachusetts, to consider the signing of the Declaration of Independence. The signing of the Declaration was a decisive moment in the war of independence as it marked the birth of a new nation. Each stamp commemorates the signing of the Declaration and the birth of the United States.

## 1975 BICENTENNIAL FIRST DAY COVER

In the same month of 1774 and 1775, when the first of Bunker Hill was closed by British forces, the town occupied by British forces, Bunker Hill, continued to receive messages of their resistance to the British in surrounding colonies. During a "windy night" of April 1775, two ships from the town of Bunker Hill, with human spirits, met in England, of the danger in arms by approaching Bunker Hill and to assist the military forces of the American army, and to warn Congress that the British were about to attack. When the British had just of the British, Bunker was finally designed by British forces. It was Dr. Edmund Bunker, Bunker's captain, who received the first message.
